- 16.950 inhabitantes
- One of the oldest cities in Poland

- The city was destroyed twice in 1409 and in 1431
- 1793 the city was part of Preußen
- 1807 the city was part of Warschau
- After the first world war it was Polish again

Monuments of Toruń

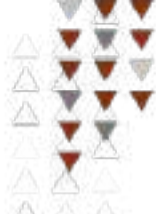
1. It was built in the 13th and 14th century and after it was destroyed the town hall was rebuilt in the 18th century.
